



Deferred Action: Information and Documents Required for Application

Evidence:

1. Documents for Identification Purposes:

- Valid Birth Certificate plus a photo ID (ID from school, work, or other) OR
- Passport

2. Evidence showing US entry before the age of 16:

Any document showing the applicant's name and verifying presence in the United States before the age of 16 (Most common: school report cards/transcripts, immunization records, leases, etc):

3. Evidence showing the applicant's presence in the United States continuously from 2007 to 2014 (at least one piece of evidence per year through date of submission):

4. Evidence showing the applicant was present in the United States on June 15, 2012:

5. Documents showing the applicant has completed high school, is in school, has obtained a GED, or is in the process of earning a GED during the application process (Example: Degree, transcripts, or proof of current school registration):

____ A list of addresses where applicant has lived since first entry (as many as can be remembered)
